Evidence of Impact 2014/2015:

The impact of Sport Premium Funding is very positive and the funding has already impacted our school in the following ways:

PE & School Sport is developing a higher profile across the whole school (School Games notice board, all year groups taking part in inter school competitions, after school sports clubs every day, timetabled playtime and lunchtime activities daily).

Increased confidence of staff teaching curriculum PE

Improved skill levels with teachers clearly focussed on developing physical skills within each lesson and unit of work. Feedback regarding the Real PE scheme has been positive from staff and children alike.

Higher numbers of pupils participating in inter-school competitive events and with success. Results are posted on the website following events.

Children signposted to local sports clubs as a result of Leeds United and Leeds Rhinos offers and links with other local clubs

Increased engagement of staff in our school's P.E and School Sport agenda

Increased participation in lunchtime and playtime outdoor activities

Higher levels of pupil interest and enjoyment in sport and sport-related activities
